AFA Honors Timberlake and Mountcastle

The Richmond Chapter of the Air Force Association has honored CMSgt Herbert L. Timberlake as the Virginia Air National Guard Airman of the Year and Capt. Barry W. Mountcastle as Junior Officer of the Year.

Both men received plaques at the chapter's quarterly meeting Oct. 27 at the Holiday Inn Airport. The awards recognized the two airmen's contributions during 1988. The Junior Officer of the Year award is named in honor of Maj. James P. Gunter, a 149th Tactical Fighter Squadron pilot who died when his airplane exploded at an air show in North Carolina.

The event's featured speaker was Lt. Col. Bill Rose, commander of the 192d Tactical Fighter Group. Colonel Rose spoke about the Air Guard's recent deployment to Evenes Air Station, Norway.

Sentre Partner Tsgt. Joe Cheatham

"We enjoy it. I Think it's great." That's the way TSgt. Butch McKinnon, a full time technician with the 157th Air Refueling Group, describes the New Hampshire Air National Guard's participation in Sentre Partner.

Sentre Partner is a program authorized by Air National Guard Regulation 60-8, - also known as the Spouse Orientation Flight Program. This program provides the opportunity for spouses of guard members from Resources, Combat support, Maintenance, and Operations to take an orientation flight in a KC-135 Stratotanker. The 157th provides support for this program seven to eight times a year, and provided rides for members of the 192d TFG this year.

According to Maj Bill Martin of the 149th TFS, the purpose of Sentre Partner is "To enhance the spouse's working knowledge of the types of flying activities that we regularly participate in. This is important, since deployments and regular duties require family members, as well as guardsmen, to make considerable sacrifices. This program enables them to view our operations first hand."

The concert, "Serenade in Blue," features big band, jazz and vocal selections of movie music spanning the past 60 years. The band's commander and conductor is LtCol James M. Bankhead.

The United States Air Force Band has performed in 55 countries on five continents during 12 international goodwill tours.

Although regulations prohibit carrying more than eight spouses per filight, the Stratotanker can carry up to 22 passengers. The exact number depends upon the aircrew, since carrying too many people could interfere with refueling operations. This year 16 members and their spouses had the opportunity to participate. 1lt Darrick Seale from the 192d Base Education and Training Office and his wife May were among those who flew with the 157th on October 22.

"It was lots of fun," said 1Lt Seale." I wish more of our wives could go and get a chance to see what we do." His wife echoed these comments adding that she thought that the flight was more "Intense" than a commercial flight. "You don't really feel the force of the air on a commercial flight. I really enjoyed it. I'm ready to go again."

Both of the two hour flights provided opportunities to watch aerial refueling, listen to communications on the headsets, and to ride in the cockpit area with the aircrew. You can also see other planes flying in formation with your own. Sentre Partner and the 157th provide a rare opportunity for the people who support the 192d TFG to get a first hand look at the Virginia Air National Guard at work.



- 4. Commanders may utilize Rescheduled Unit Training Assemblies (RUTAs) to achieve training objectives using maximum availability of equipment and full-time personnel resources that cannot be achieved during UTAs and SUTAs.
 RUTAs will not be used for the convenience of the individual.
- 5. Equivalent Training (EQT) may be authorized by commanders for personal attendance problems if requested in advance. EQT with pay must be performed within 30 days of the missed UTA and within the same fiscal year. Only four EQT periods with pay are permitted each fiscal year. EQT without pay (retirement point only) may be authorized when the individual is unable to make an EQT in a pay status.
