192d Fighter Wing deploys to Curação

The 192d Fighter Wing has headed south to the tiny Island of Curaçao for the unit's first Aerospace Expeditionary Force deployment. The island — part of the Netherlands Antilles — is one of three islands about 70 miles off the northeastern coast of South America. The Advance Team took off the Wednesday after Thanksgiving and the rest of the contingent flies down Dec. 1.

The December-long deployment has been divided into two with nearly 60 Wing members going for each half

of the month.

The deployment package includes aircraft, pilots, operations staff, aircraft maintenance members and a small number of support personnel. Lt.Col. Pete Bonanni, 192d Operations Group commander, serves as detachment commander for the first half of the deployment, and Wing Commander Col. Steve Hicks takes over for the last half of the deployment.

While in Curaçao the Wing's aircraft and personnel will be assigned

to Operation Nighthawk; they'll stay on alert, fly counterdrug missions over the Caribbean, and tackle some flying training requirements.

During December and continuing through February 2001, the Wing is also sending individuals and small groups to several locations around the world in support of other AEF missions. Wing personnel are heading to Turkey to support Northern Watch and to Germany, France, and Saudi Arabia & Kuwait in support of on-going U.S. expeditionary force missions.

Va. National Guard gains unit

Joint Forces augmentation unit stands up

The Virginia National Guard grew one unit larger on Nov. 18. At 11 a.m. in the auditorium at the Armed Forces Staff College on Norfolk Naval Base, the Joint National Guard Augmentation Unit stood up.

The mission of the newly activated unit is to augment the mission of the U.S. Joint Forces Command.

Specifically, the new unit will assist Joint Forces Command in developing joint doctrine and training. JFC is headquartered at Norfolk Naval Base and is commanded by a four-star general.

Commanding the Joint NG Augmentation Unit is the Virginia Air Guard's own Colonel Robert Newman (formerly with the 192d Fighter Wing and most recently the VaANG State Headquarters). The unit currently has 50 National Guard positions assigned:


40 Army Guard and 10 Air Guard. Members of both the Virginia and North Carolina National Guard are filling the positions.

The new unit met about 50 percent of its staffing needs by August and is continuing to recruit, according to Colonel Newman. "It is vital that we put outstanding, hardworking individuals into these positions," Newman said. "A high level of performance will be expected from the unit. It will be demanding work, but it is also a great way to gather joint experience. This is the way the U.S. will fight in the future — not just interservice, but also on a multinational level with our NATO partners."

The unit will use Joint Vision 2020 as a focal point in JFC doctrine development. "We must understand

the shape and character of the enemy, become better at using information and technology to improve our information warfare and fighting capabilities, learn to strike more quickly and become more stealthy," Newman explained.

The unit's current vacancies include a couple slots for master and senior master sergeants (E-6–E-8) and a few openings for major through colonel (O-4–O-6). For more information about these vacancies, contact CMSgt. Vickie Armes, ext. 6462.

192d FW man earns 'distinguished' marksman title

TSgt. Cash follows in father's footsteps

Shooting his pistol has always been a favorite pastime for TSgt. Krag-Stevens Cash of the 192d Logistic Group's Maintenance Squadron. And he hardly ever misses his mark! Proof of his expertise was demonstrated recently when Cash won the Spatz Trophy as the top Air Force competitor at the National Rifle Association's National Championships held at Camp Perry, Ohio in July.

That's not a feat won easily. Cash competed against nearly 30 marksmen & women during two separate tournaments to collect enough points for the Spatz Trophy. The sergeant used 45-caliber Colt in the President's 100 competition and again in the Excellence in Competition match to capture the award.

Besides winning the Spatz, Cash's team also won the national match pistol competition and the Centerfire match competition. Cash was part of the All Guard Team during these contests. More than 800 military and civilian competitors participated in the tournaments.

Cash also boasts another record of sorts. He is only the third person in the history of the VaANG to earn the title 'distinguished' with a service pistol. This is especially noteworthy when you consider the first person to receive this distinction was Cash's father, retired CMSgt. Robert K. Cash. CMSgt. Ray Bassetti, VaANG StHq Command CMSgt., was the second recipient. "My father was very inspirational in my decision to compete in rifle competitions," Cash said.

His win at Camp Perry this year marks the eighth year he's competed at a national level competition with this year marking his first year to win an individual honor at this level of event. But, he's still no stranger to winning. The Waynesboro, Va., native's previous winnings include the Browning High Power Match (45-caliber) and the Uzi (machine gun) competition

in Belgium. In 1999, he was also a member of the winning Three Gun competition at the interservice championships.

The 16-year VaANG veteran practices shooting on average three days per week. He can be found practicing at home, on base, or on 22 acres he has access to in New Kent. Various exercises held throughout the year and around the world also help keep his sharp shooter skills honed, according to the man. He plans to continue competing next year with hopes to make the All Guard team again. "A dream of mine has always been to compete at the Olympic level," he admitted.

Cash made sure to note that he gets a lot of support from his wife, Calvin Ann and his daughter Lisa Renee. He also juggles his civilian job

responsibilities as an international shipping coordinator for AMF Bakery Systems in Richmond and a few hobbies such as hunting and fishing. "There's more to practice than just shooting. There's also a lot of mental practice and discipline involved too," he explained.

The 192d Fighter Wing's Marksmanship Team is always looking for interested VaANG members to join their team, according to the sergeant. "We get great base-wide support. We can always use a little more help, and we appreciate the many people who've shown interest in the team," he ended.

OSD mandates new Information Assurance training

VaANG members need training by Dec. 31

The Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD) recently mandated new Information Assurance (IA) computer based training (CBT) for all members of the Department of Defense. All VaANG personnel must complete this training requirement by Dec. 31, 2000, explains MSgt. Hutt Williams, Base Information Assurance Manager.

In addition to the "Computer Use" training everyone must receive, Systems Administrators (SA) and Workgroup Managers (WM) must complete additional training. SA/WM personnel must take the Systems Administrator (SYS Admin) CBT by Dec. 31.

The IA CBT has 6 modules and exams, but LAN (VaANG local area network) users are currently required to take only Module Two: "Computer Use." Systems Administrators and Workgroup Managers must also complete the SYS Admin CBT. Completion of the INFOCON CBT is not yet required.

This new computer-based training must be accomplished no later than Dec. 31 regardless of when any previous IA CBT training was completed. Failure to complete Module Two by Dec. 31 will result in suspension of your LAN access.

Before the IA CBT training can be started, users must register at https:/ /afcbt.den.disa.mil/usafcbt/default.htm from a .mil domain computer. It is suggested that during the December drill, you complete the IA CBT that has been placed on the VaANG LAN. However, once registered from a .mil domain, you may access the many other computer based training courses that are available, from a home computer. All LAN users must register at the above web page in order to get credit for this new OSD mandate. When the IA CBT is completed on the VaANG LAN, scores are exported back to the AFCBT web site and are tracked by the HQ Air Force

Communications Agency (AFCA) at Scott AFB, Ill. No credit will be given for tests taken if the user is not registered prior to taking the training. The VaANG has no control over the tracking procedures. HO AFCA and ANG are the controlling agencies, and they will generate rosters of units out of compliance.

The following are facts concerning the new IA CBT:

- 1. You must first register at the AFCBT web site mentioned above. IA CBT registration help information can be found on the LAN under (make the following selections) Network Applications, Training, SATE Training, and SATE Registration Help Information. Once the user is registered, the IA CBT can be completed using the VaANG network. (Be sure to write down the student number given to you on the AFCBT registration screen; you'll need it for the next step.)
- 2. The IA CBT is located on the LAN under (make the following selections) Network Applications, Training, SATE Training, and New SATE Training. Enter "self" on the Users Detail screen to initially launch the IA CBT. The next screen asks for a

Name and Number. This is the student number from the AFCBT registration screen. Enter the student number instead of "self" for later CBT sessions.

- 3. Remember, only the Computer Use Module of the IA CBT must be completed by the Dec. 31 deadline, but beginning in February 2001, all modules will have to be completed. (More information on these requirements will be published in the coming months.)
- 4. A minimum score of 70% is passing for each IA CBT module.
- 5. Training progress can be viewed at the above web site approximately 3-5 days after module completion
- 6. All new LAN users (VaANG members who don't yet have computer accounts) must see unit SATE manager to complete this training requirement, or come to the Communications Flight to complete it in paper format. You won't be given a LAN account until you've completed Module Two.
- 7. Mass IA instruction briefings/ testings are permitted. If your unit wishes to conduct a mass briefing/


